# THE HISTORY OF OUR MOVEMENT

In **2008**, under the leadership of Pastor Jerry Sweat, Beach Church started a weekly worship gathering to reach ages 18-35, the 'lost' generation — the un-churched, the de-churched. Pastor Jerry asked Pastor Joby Martin to lead this new service held Sundays at 11:22am.

In **September 2009**, the 11:22am hour was at capacity, so the same worship experience was offered on Thursdays at 7:22pm.



Our first **Easter in 2009**, showed signs of being more than just a weekly worship service.

Over 1,500 people poured in to celebrate the resurrection. We began to be affectionately referred to as Eleven22.



In July 2011,

11:22am on Sunday and 7:22pm on Thursday did not provide enough capacity for the hundreds of people showing up every week, so the same worship experience was offered on Sundays at 6:22pm. By early **2011**, a distinctly Eleven22 culture and vibe were firmly established. As God continued to expand the impact of Eleven22, he also began to clarify the vision. Pastor Jerry Sweat challenged Pastor Joby Martin that it was time for him to become the Lead Pastor of a church, and that he wanted to help him launch a church. With that, the movement known as The Church of Eleven22 was born to be a place for all people to discover and deepen a relationship with Jesus Christ.

#### **September 23, 2012**,

The Church of Eleven22 held its first worship gathering in its new facility and over 3,000 people attended the first weekend.





Beach Church and Eleven22 kick off a joint capital campaign called **Upon This Rock**, the fruit of which builds out The Church of Eleven22 facility at Beach and San Pablo in Jacksonville, Florida.



January 2013 brought an additional 1,000 people to The Church of Eleven22 to experience the love of Jesus Christ. An additional service on Sunday at 5:22pm was added, increasing the weekly gathering number from three to four.

# THE HISTORY OF OUR MOVEMENT

In the **Spring of 2013**, families were being turned away due to lack of space for children. We announced our first expansion — The Restore Project. Rooted in Acts 15, the call was to restore the final 20,000 square feet of the building at San Pablo and Beach so more children and adults could come and discover a relationship with Jesus Christ.

**January 2014** brought an additional 1,000 people to experience the Gospel. Our newly 'restored' space opened, including the Sanctuary where 500 people can worship.



In **June 2013**, more than 200 people were baptized in the ocean at our first Beach Baptism, while hundreds of friends and family watched from the beach.

By **December 2014**, almost 5,000 people were worshiping at Eleven22 each weekend. Since opening day in 2012, there were 1,045 people who surrendered their lives to Jesus and 465 people were baptized.


Yet again, **January 2015** brought an additional 1,000 people to The Church of Eleven22. To meet the anticipated growth, the Sunday 1:30pm worship gathering kicked off, increasing the weekly gathering number from four to five.

In **September 2015**, just three short years after launching, we celebrated salvation number 3,000. That's 3000 salvations since opening day in 2012.



In **August 2015**, as part of a community transformation effort, Hope's Closet opened — a thrift store designed to bring dignity to those it serves, and to offer the hope of Jesus to all who enter.

October 2015, we launch our biggest initiative to date — the Before All Things generosity initiative — a two year discipleship journey where we learn and live out the reality that Jesus is Before All Things.



## L L INITIATIVES L COVERVIEW

This initiative is the largest step of faith we have taken as a church. What would it mean for your generosity if you had a full grasp on the preeminence of Christ and what first fruits giving actually is? What would it look like if your testimony of generosity created a legacy honoring and drawing more people to Jesus?

This is not about Eleven22. This is about Jesus. It's about His power at work within us to accomplish things by Him, for Him, to Him, and through Him.

Our primary goal is 100% participation. We would like 100% of us who call The Church of Eleven22 home to go before God and have a life-changing encounter as it relates to our generosity.

We are believing God for our secondary goal of \$24 million to accomplish four Gospel-centered initiatives in the next two years.

We will continue to hold weekly worship gatherings, connect people through serving and Disciple Groups, go on short-term mission trips and transform communities locally and globally. We call this **making disciple-making disciples**, and it has been our ministry objective since we opened. We will simply continue to do it.

As we look to the years ahead, we pray that this church facility will be our home base and a launching pad for thousands to discover and deepen a relationship with Jesus Christ.

### ■ INITIATIVE FOUR

## SOW GOSPEL IISEED

We want to be a conduit of God's blessing by sowing Gospel seed in Jacksonville and around the world.

Locally, we will partner with Jacksonville organizations to build a jobs creation initiative to provide living wage jobs to local families. We believe one of the most effective ways to break the cycle of poverty is to provide access to employment.

Globally, we will partner with church planting organizations to plant 100 churches in the next two years – primarily in Brazil and East Africa. These churches will operate independent of The Church of Eleven22, with trained native Pastors, Bibles in their own language, and a building in which to meet. Our partners are currently preparing the soil in those areas for our church planting efforts.





# GENEROSITY GENEROSITY

The Generosity Journey is a tool designed to help you move money from being an idol to money being a tool for God's kingdom. The Journey focuses on the condition of our hearts further transforming us into the likeness of Christ.

Each step of the Journey represents growth in a lifestyle of generosity and sacrifice.

These are not steps you slowly ascend to get to God, but rather a way to evaluate must is gift. your growth in generosity. The Apostle Paul

through the giving boxes.

#### **Intentional Giver**

This type of giver begins asking the question, "Why am I giving more to my cell phone bill than I am giving to God? Should I be giving to God more than I give for my mortgage each month?" This giver starts to make their giving an intentional choice that reflects how they feel about it in relation to other things they spend their money on.



This type of giver begins to ask the question, "Am I giving in a way that changes me? Am I giving in a way that causes my lifestyle to be different to reflect the transformation Christ is making in me?" A Sacrificial Giver's commitment to giving actually governs the rest of his/her lifestyle. A Sacrificial Giver has a giving commitment that is "larger than their current situation" so that they have to adjust the rest of their expenditures to meet that commitment.

#### **Lifetime Giver**

A Lifetime Giver is no longer asking the question, "God, how much are you asking me to give?" A Lifetime Giver is asking the question, "God, how much are you asking me to keep?" They ask this so that they can release the rest into Kingdom purposes. Much like a Sacrificial Giver makes a commitment that will govern his/her monthly and annual decisions, a Lifetime Giver makes a lifetime or longerterm giving commitment that governs his/her larger decisions like homes, cars, investments, and the like.

## WHAT'S A "ONE FUND" INITIATIVE?

You may have been a part of church where you were asked to give a second gift 'above and beyond' your usual gifts to make special initiatives like new buildings and new ministries possible.


Normally, you gave that gift to the 'Building Fund' and you also continued to give offerings to the 'General Fund.' This type of giving can be confusing to people who either don't have a baseline for their "usual giving" or who aren't able to celebrate the total giving they are engaging in.



We believe we are on ONE MISSION – the mission for ALL people to discover and deepen a relationship with Jesus Christ. We will have one fund to which we give at The Church of Eleven22. No more 'special campaigns.' It is all ONE fund.

The BEFORE ALL THINGS initiative is for two years (December 2015 through December 2017). Every gift you bring to God through The Church of Eleven22 over the next two years will support the four initiatives of BEFORE ALL THINGS: Cultivate Ministry, Put Down Roots, Plant the Gospel and Sow Gospel Seed.

Everyone who calls The Church of Eleven22 home will be asked to make a commitment the weekend of November 19/22. We have included a sample commitment card so you can look it over and pray about your commitment amount.



## FAQs for BEFORE ALL THINGS

If we are committing to Before All Things, how does this change my giving to missions, the general fund, and other special offerings? ## more towards Before All Things?

Be creative as you explore ways you and your family can give to Before All Things. You can donate stock, property or other valuable items. You may have stored resources (investment accounts, large bank accounts, etc.) that God has blessed you with that He may be calling you to give out of during this time. #### How long is my commitment?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment, which is 24 months. The fulfillment period for your commitment will begin with our First Big Give on the weekend of December 3/6, 2015 and it will culminate in December of 2017.

# What if I don't have a job right now? What does that mean for my Before All Things commitment?

Before All Things is about your total, radical, sacrificial generosity to God's mission at The Church of Eleven22. We believe that God calls us to action in times of hardship just as much as He does in times of abundance, and that looks different for every person. Before All Things is about a heart change - one that is only accomplished by surrendering our lives completely over to God in



The third initiative was to Plant the Gospel. Because we are a movement for ALL people, we are partners in reaching your friends

and neighbors with the hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We want a great number of people to come to the Lord and that great number is one more. Two years ago, we began planting the Gospel in new communities by opening the Baymeadows campus led by Pastor Ryan Stone in January of 2016. We continued planting the Gospel with the launch of the Mandarin campus in January of 2017 led by Pastor Ben Phillips. As we continue to be one church in multiple locations we are launching the Arlington campus led by Pastor John Barringer in January of 2018.



Over two thousand years ago Jesus stood in Caesarea Philippi and asked Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" and Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the son of the living God." Jesus made it clear that He would build upon this public proclamation a movement of believers who follow Him. This called out community would eventually become known as the church.

As we look across the history of the church we are humbled by the smallness of ourselves. From the age of Jesus and his Apostles, through the age of the Reformation and into our generation, God continues to call his people to move. Through this same spirit of ekklesia, this

spirit of movement, God initiated a call at Beach in 2008. The call was to start a new service with the intent of reaching people in acute need of Jesus.

Over the last three years we have seen 1,100 people come to Christ, baptized 350, walked 240 through Beginning Point (our class for new believers and those returning to the faith), had 375 people complete Disciple I (an intensive study that walks through 80% of the Bible), and sent over 250 missionaries to four countries.

Just in the past few weeks we've seen 20 salvations and 3 baptisms from our organic outreach to the Portside community and 24

student salvations at our Epworth retreat.

Results like this are due only to the power of God moving through people like us.

The service we started three years ago is now becoming a church of it's own. When Eleven22 moves into a new location, we will free up space at Beach for more salvation and discipleship. The whole point of our place on the timeline is to join the movement Jesus began.

As Christians, most of us recognize that no work of God comes without cost. Christ paid the price for our redemption; we pay a price to follow Him. Out of obedience to God, Beach built much needed space

where greater numbers of people could meet and worship Jesus.

Over the past few years, Beach has put off many expenditures and maintenance for the sake of gospel growth. We are now filled to capacity with a facility in need of improvement, insufficient parking, and three mortgages; one of which requires a \$19,000 monthly payment, which this campaign seeks to eliminate.

Beach can continue to operate paying \$19,000 per month over the 8 years left on this mortgage or we can eliminate this portion of our debt saving almost \$300,000 in interest.

Imagine what God can do with this kind of

financial freedom. How many churches would He launch? How many hungry bellies would He feed? How many homes would He build? How many needy children would He save?

To continue proclaiming the gospel of Jesus boldly and without hindrance, both Beach and Eleven22 need to be healthy. A healthy church not only includes paying off debt, but for Eleven22 it includes constructing a facility and providing a safe environment for children and adults. As participants in this campaign, we are committed to continuing to give where we go after the launch of Eleven22.

As two healthy churches, Eleven22 and Beach could potentially disciple 6,000 adults and

countless children each week. Just this year at Beach we have had 453 salvations. Imagine two churches operating at full capacity. How many people will God save through our obedience?

If God does what He's been doing over the course of this three-year campaign, we could see 2,200 people come to Christ, baptize 700, walk 480 through Beginning Point, and help over 750 people complete Disciple I. We could send out over 500 missionaries to more countries.... all of this if God only remains status quo.

But here's the thing: our God is the, sovereign, immortal, invisible, eternal, almighty God of

the universe, the great I AM. He hung the stars and knows them by name. The universe is held in the span of His palm. He is not status quo, He never has been.

It's us who get in the way of the gospel.
We are the ones who remain status quo,
not God. God "is able to do immeasurably
more than all we ask or imagine, according
to his power that is at work within us..."
Ephesians 3:20

Paul wrote this sentence while in prison to his friends in the church at Ephesus — where he had once preached the gospel standing under the archway featured on the front of this brochure. And Paul

believed it. He was not status quo. Paul actively believed the God of the universe *could* do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine. What would happen if we believed like Paul?

Paul's public proclamation of the gospel helped 'launch' the church at Ephesus, as well as the churches in Macedonia. The Macedonian church gave to the Corinthian church as much as they were able and even beyond their ability.

So, you see, this launching of churches and sharing of funds is not new.
