This journey was primarily about discipleship and individual growth but God also gave us a vision for what He wanted to accomplish through us as a movement during this two year period. The first initiative was to Cultivate Ministry. We wanted to continue to hold weekly worship gatherings, connect people through serving and Disciple Groups, go on short-term mission trips and transform communities locally and globally. We call this

CT Studd said "The light that shines farthest shines brightest at home." With that in mind,

our fourth initiative was to Sow Gospel Seeds in Jacksonville and around the world. Locally, we started a Jobs Initiative through Hope's Closet to help change the trajectory of a few families' lives. Through this program a job fair was hosted at Eleven22 in which 62 people have received new jobs. Globally, we partnered with church planting organizations with a goal to plant over 100 churches primarily in Brazil and East Africa. These churches operate independently of The Church of Eleven22, have trained native Pastors, Bibles in their own language, and a building in which to gather. The third initiative was to Plant the Gospel. Because we are a movement for ALL people, we are partners in reaching your friends and neighbors with the hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We want a great number of people to come to the Lord and that great number is one more. Two years ago, we began planting the Gospel in new communities by opening the Baymeadows campus led by Pastor Ryan Stone in January of 2016. We continued planting the Gospel with the launch of the Mandarin campus in January of 2017 led by Pastor Ben Phillips. As we continue to be one church in multiple locations we are launching the Arlington campus led by Pastor John Barringer in January of 2018.

The second initiative was to Put Down Roots. We wanted to purchase the San Pablo building to use it as a launching pad for this movement. Facilities are important because they help facilitate ministry. And just like God has transformed us, dirty and broken into something valuable, He turned an old Wal-Mart at the San Pablo campus into a place where thousands have surrendered their life to the Lordship of Jesus Christ.
